Ocean acidification in New Zealand

- NZOAC members in Dunedin are invited to join Otago's Future Ocean Research Theme, who
 welcome Emily Frost (AUT) for a seminar on Assessing embryo fate development as a means of
 selective climate adaptation in marine invertebrates (4 August, 4 pm, Marine Science seminar
 room).

Acidification, fisheries, and aquaculture

- Through case studies of eleven countries (including New Zealand), researchers at Dalhousie University assess the implementation of <u>climate change adaptation into fisheries management policy</u> and legislation.
- A recent modelling study by researchers at the University of British Columbia focused on the
 fisheries catch potential of 210 major shellfish fisheries species. Their results suggest that ocean
 acidification is amplifying the negative effects of other ocean stressors (e.g., warming and
 deoxygenation).
