#### Ocean acidification in the New Zealand and the Pacific

- A new <u>real-time marine monitoring system</u> at University of Otago's Portobello Marine Laboratory allows the public to view and download temperature, pH, O<sub>2</sub>, chlorophyll-a, and salinity data from Otago Harbour.
- <u>Palau International Coral Reef Center's</u> (PICRC) Ikelau Otto and McQuinnley Mesengei have begun a fellowship in Chris Sabine's lab at University of Hawaii. This opportunity will significantly <u>expand Palau's capacity to study OA</u>.

## Acidification, fisheries, and aquaculture

- In Ocean Futures for the World's Largest Yellowfin Tuna Population Under the Combined
   Effects of Ocean Warming and Acidification, researchers suggest that the combined effects
   of warming and OA will result in an eastward shift in the distribution of yellowfin tuna. They
   predict these changes will challenge the global fishing industry and the economies and food
   systems of Pacific Island Countries.
- In the last instalment of <u>The Alaska Ocean Acidification Network's</u> Spring Discussion Series, speakers discussed <u>OA adaptation and mitigation approaches</u>.
