

NZOAC and PI-TOA November/December Newsletter

It was great to catch up with many of you earlier this week at the 2022 NZOAC meeting (OA Day). Held at the University of Auckland, the open discussion focused on topics with communication and knowledge gaps: ocean alkalinity enhancement, ocean carbon capture, and OA adaptation and mitigation approaches. We also welcomed two new NZOAC Council members: Joanna Copedo (Cawthron) and Tyler Feary (University of Otago).

As expected, COP27 brought attention to the urgency of addressing OA. The Prime Minister of Samoa, Hon. Fiame Naomi Mata'afa, highlighted OA in her call for action: "Increased acidification of our ocean is already destroying entire reef ecosystems which may never be recovered. Reef damage affects fish population which in turn affect entire fisheries upon which we rely. This is a stark reminder of how interconnected the effects of climate change are with our environments, and our daily lives." King of Tonga, His Majesty King Tupou VI, highlighted the difficulties faced by Tongans dealing with a reaction, including OA, coastal erosion, loss of coral reefs, and extreme weather events.

Congratulations to NZOAC's Christopher Cornwall, who was awarded The Royal Society's Hamilton Award. The award was given in recognition of Christopher's recent coral reef work, which was "the <u>first to estimate the effects of climate change</u> on the ability of hundreds of real-world coral reefs to grow".

Ocean acidification in the New Zealand and the Pacific

2022 has been a fruitful year for OA research in the Pacific and New Zealand. The Pacific Island Ocean Acidification Centre (PIOAC) is now fully established and held its first in-person upskilling and planning activity in Fiji. In partnership with University of Otago, NIWA, The Ocean Foundation, and the OA Alliance, PIOAC also contributed to Pacific-focused programmes on OA monitoring, policy, and response that trained over 180 participants. Other regional news:

- New Zealand's <u>Our Marine Environment 2022</u> discusses the impact of OA on people and the environment.
- A session on OA monitoring in the Pacific was held in Port-Moresby during the National Ocean Science to Service Workshop (17 - 21 November). Hosted by the PNG National Weather Service, this was supported by the <u>COSPPac</u> project and co-implemented by SPC, PCCOS, SPREP, and the Australian Bureau of Meteorology.
- A National Ocean Science to Service Workshop is currently taking place in Tarawa, Kiribati, with a dedicated OA session organised by <u>COSPPac</u> and <u>PCCOS</u>.
- Three new Pacific Island research groups have been <u>awarded GOA-ON in a box kits</u> by The Ocean Foundation.
